

THIS WEEK'S MEETING:

We thoroughly enjoyed our visit with Sara Trenery who is a wealth of information! Sara, whose office is in the Old Court House in Towson, has been with the County for 20+ years. If a company is ready to expand, add new employees, relocate, Sara's department offers assistance and county process guidance at no cost—financing, tax incentives, small business counseling, hiring, site search, etc. Workforce recruitment is also offered with pre-screening of applicants, matching skills with available jobs. Three Career Centers, one on McCormick Road, provide a variety of employment and support resources to assist job seekers in achieving their employment goals. Sara then filled us in on development projects around the Beltway: Tradepoint Atlantic is huge. It is the redevelopment of the Sparrows Point peninsula and will have warehouses and distribution centers, proximity to the port the drawing card, and Gotham Greens, produce grown in warehouses. Blue Ocean will develop a large unused tract of land by Martin's Airport that will include recreational fields as well as residential and commercial components. Towson Row is the southern gateway to Towson; Towson University is expanding into central Towson, and Circle East is a \$30 million development at York and Joppa Roads (w/a Shake Shack for Nancy). Owings Mills Metro Centre has opened a new apartment building, and a hotel is under construction. Catonsville aspires to become Baltimore County's first Arts and Entertainment District, and UMBC is becoming a leading research university in cybersecurity-related disciplines. The Guinness Brewery in Halethorpe has been a huge draw from inside and outside the area, its popularity spilling over to nearby breweries. Now, back to our neck of the woods.... Corner of Beaver Dam and Padonia, already an F rated intersection, now has a storage facility when Macaroni Grill was. Sheetz gas station and convenience store was proposed where Bob Evans was, but difficult access from I83 may be an insurmountable roadblock. Something large is proposed for southeast corner next to PayPal—apartments? Owners of several shopping centers--Padonia Village, Shawan Plaza, Timonium Square, Radcliffe Plaza (Kenilworth and York)--have requested zoning changes to allow for mixed family residences/retail. The property where Christopher Michael was will be a Royal Farm. There are also plans for the upper level of Sears Hunt Valley—apartments? Hotel? Senior housing? Wow! Lots going on! Thanks, Sara!
